MUSIC REVIEW

A Benefit For WFMU Of Upsala

WFMU BENEFIT. The marginal masses gather to help rescue the feisty college radio station. With Sonic Youth, Painkiller, Dim Stars, Jad Fair, Gumball and Love Child. Saturday night. Ritz, 225 W. 48th St., Manhattan.

HEN IT COMES to diverse pop music with an uncompromising bite, tuning in a decent New York radio station is no less impossible than tracking down the perfect record store. But for those who don't mind fiddling with their antennas, Upsala College's WFMU (91.1 FM), in East Orange, N. J., has long been the local musical fringe's best friend. With something to delight and offend nearly everybody, WFMU's alternative programing makes other college rock stations sound middle-of-the-road. Because of legal technicalities involving a 1962 surveying error, however, three much larger neighboring stations have taken WFMU to court in hopes of getting its already modest 1440 watts of power slashed nearly in half. Saturday's nearly sold-out Ritz concert was a benefit to raise funds for the legal battles ahead.

Even though they record for a major label (Geffen), Sonic Youth remains the quintessential indie-label, college rock band. Mustering all the power and deranged verve that seemed to be absent from their recent arena tour opening for Neil Young, Sonic Youth recuperated and expanded upon most aspects of punk and postpunk history. It's paradoxical music, simultaneously alienating and community-affirming, ironic and respectful of tradition. Having rediscovered song structure a couple of albums ago, the band has subsequently figured out new ways to take them apart again with ungainly grace, humor and feedback.

Humor was about the only thing missing from Painkiller's short set. Fronted by alto saxophonist John Zorn (along with bassist Bill Laswell and Napalm Death drummer Mick Harris), Painkiller fused power-trio angst and deadly volume with Downtown improvisational strategies. Using circular breathing and vein-busting screams, Zorn attempted to stretch the boundaries of musical context and audience tolerance, and almost succeeded.

In contrast, Jad Fair's surprise appearance was a Zenlike representation of the soul of rock-and-roll economy: one man, one electric guitar, and two songs. The gawky leader of former quintessential indie-rock band 1/2 Japanese couldn't have memorialized the death of the seven-inch single more meaningfully if he'd meant to.

If you had arrived at the Ritz expecting the evening to begin fashionably late, you would have missed Gumball and Love Child, local bands that infuse rock with equal amounts of disdain and regard. On the other hand, you might have wanted to pass on Dim Stars, a one-shot supergroup parody consisting of writer / actor / former punk rocker Richard Hell, Sonic Youth guitarist (Thurston Moore) and drummer (Steve Shelley), and Gumball guitarist Don Fleming. Garage rock will remain a vital component of the pop experience as long as there are those, like Hell, who have played bass guitar for more than a dozen years and yet still sound like they picked it up for the first time last week.

Sonic Youth, Zorn, Fair, and Hell - for all their campus credibility — are anathema to New York local radio. Which may be why even East Villager Thurston Moore, upon leaving the stage after his band's equipment-mangling encore, was heard to mutter, "See you at Pier Platters." That's a record store in Hoboken, N. J.

Coming to a Station's Aid

The way the rock underground has been shrinking over the last few years, it's no surprise that eventually it would become a political cause. Tomorrow night at the Ritz, Sonic Youth and the saxophonist John Zorn, two of the staunchest supporters and survivors of the underground scene, will headline a benefit for WFMU-FM (91.1), a listener-sponsored radio station in East Orange, N.J. For more than 25 years, WFMU has been operating as a free-form' radio station; these days you might hear Sonic Youth and Mr. Zorn back to back with James Brown, Fugazi and completely obscure independent rockers and homemade tapes. WFMU is high-concept radio; all sounds are created equal, with an emphasis on music that can't be heard on commercial or even college radio. The station's charter is in danger from other areas stations trying

to increase their power; the money raised will go toward a legal? defense fund.

Sonic Youth will be mixing new, unreleased material with their standard noise-guitar, ligroove jams. Mr. Zorn will, offer the American debut of a new hoise-thrash combo called Painkiller, which features Bill Laswell on bass. Richard Hell, the author and former leader of the 1970; spunk! band the Voidoids will give his first New York performance in eight years, fronting a grunge-guitar group called Dim Stars, which also feature members of Sonic Youth. Also on the bill are the bands Gumball and Lové Child.

The concert is tomorrow night at the Ritz, 254 West 54th Street in Manhattan. Doors open at 7 P.M.; the show begins at 8. Tickets are \$15. Information: (212) 541-8900: KAREN SCHOEMER
